Śri Mahā Ganapathi Homam/Havan

Śri Ganapathi (Sanskrit: गणपति) is also known as Ganesha, Vighneswara, Vināyaka, and Gajamukha. Śri Ganesha is the elephant-headed Devatha of power and wisdom. He is the eldest son of Śri Siva and the elder brother of Śri Kārtikeya (Subrahmanya).

Significance of Śri Mahā Ganapathi Homam:

Homam is originated from the word Havan (Sanskrit: हवन). According to the guidelines in the Vedic scriptures, Havan is a sacred purifying ritual performed by involving the sacred fire Agni (Devatha of fire). Mahā Ganapathi Homam/Havan is dedicated to Śri Ganesha and performed at the beginning of all new endeavors and to overcome obstacles and attain success. He, being Vighneswara (Devatha - who prevents obstacles) is always invoked first in any venture that we undertake.

The combination of the powerful energy of the fire element, and the chanted mantras create extremely auspicious and purifying vibrations that are beneficial to all who attend the Homam/Havan.

Join us with your family and take part in the Homam in the temple, and obtain the blessing of Śri Mahā Ganapathi.
